## A Petition for a Declaration of Ecclesiastical Invalidity based on the existence of a Prior Valid Bond of Marriage (Ligamen)

Canon 1085: "A person bound by the bond of a prior marriage, even if it was not consummated, invalidly attempts marriage. Even if the prior marriage is invalid or dissolved for any reason, it is not on that account permitted to contract another before the nullity or dissolution of the prior marriage is established legitimately and certainly."

#### **Introduction**

If a wedding takes place between two people, either of whom is bound by a **prior valid marriage**, the wedding is invalid under the law of the Catholic Church. A civil divorce, dissolution or civil annulment does not terminate the prior valid marriage bond. In this Petition, the Petitioner is seeking a Declaration by the Catholic Church his/her particular marriage to the Respondent was invalid because the wedding took place at a time when one of the parties was still subject to a valid bond of marriage. If that prior marriage has been or will be declared invalid, for any reason, by a competent Church authority, this Petition does not apply.

A standard example of the factual scenario for a Prior Bond/Ligamen case is: The Petitioner, John, asks that his marriage to Mary, the Respondent, be declared invalid because, at the time of that marriage, Mary was validly bound by a marriage vow to a former spouse, Bob (Co-Respondent).

The following documents must accompany this Petition:

- A copy of the **civil marriage license/certificate** for any marriage that is a subject of investigation in this Petition. In the above example, a copy of the civil marriage licenses for Mary and Bob, and Mary and John. Each state or nation will have a different form. We are looking for the form that provides statistical information, in particular which marriage this was for each party, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, etc. It should also contain the name of the minister or official who performed the ceremony as well as his or her title. If the state or nation of the wedding does not have such a form, the Petitioner or Advocate should explain that fact.
- A copy of the **Final Divorce Decree of Judgment of Dissolution, Divorce or Nullity** issued by the civil court terminating the civil aspect of the marriage. Each state or nation will have a different form. We are looking for the form that specifies the date on which the marriage was terminated by the civil authority. The copy must bear a stamp or imprint showing the Final Decree or Judgment has been entered by the court. (We do not want marital settlement agreements or copies of court orders regarding property). If the state or nation of the wedding does not have such a form, the Petitioner or Advocate should explain that fact.
- A copy of the Catholic party's **baptismal certificate issued by the parish or baptism within the six months** prior to the filing of the petition.

When submitting the case, the following documents MUST accompany this petition.

- 1. Marriage license for the Petitioner/Respondent, as well as Co-Respondent and their prior marriage.
- 2. Final Divorce Decree for the Petitioner/Respondent, as well as Co-Respondent and their prior divorce.
- 3. A copy of the Catholic party's baptismal certificate issued within the last six months.
